# Statement of Limited Activity (§130.046.5(2) and §130.046.6 RSMo)

## A Statement of Limited Activity report:

**CAN be filed** (instead of a full disclosure report):

1. If contributions received are \$500 or less since the last full disclosure report was filed;
2. If expenditures made are \$500 or less since the last full disclosure report was filed;
3. If no single contributor has contributed more than \$300 during the reporting period.

**CANNOT be filed** (instead of a full disclosure report):

1. For two (2) or more consecutive reporting periods if either contributions received or expenditures made during those reporting period exceeds \$500;
2. The 30 Day After Election report, if the committee has a deficit (debt) of more than \$1,000
3. The January and July Quarterly reports if the committee has a deficit (debt) of more than \$5,000

Any contributions received or expenditures made, which are not reported because a Statement of Limited Activity report is filed instead of a full disclosure report, must be included in the next full disclosure report filed.

**TIP: It is good practice to file a full disclosure report at least once per year.**

## Examples:

Scenario	Contributions Received	Expenditures Made	Single Contribution over \$300	Can a Limited Activity Report be filed?
<b>A</b>	Total rec'd for period = \$ 100	Total made for period = \$ 700	No	<b>No</b> (expenditures over \$500)
<b>B</b>	Total rec'd for period = \$ 350	Total made for period = \$ 0	Yes (Rec'd \$350 from single contributor)	<b>No</b> (rec'd contribution over \$300 from single contributor)
<b>C</b>	Total rec'd for period = \$ 200	Total made for period = \$ 250	No	<b>Yes</b> (less than \$500)
<b>D</b>	Total rec'd & not reported from last period = \$ 200 + Total rec'd for current period = \$ 450 <hr/> Total rec'd = \$ 650	Total rec'd & not reported from last period = \$ 150 + Total rec'd for current period = \$ 400 <hr/> Total made = \$ 550	No	<b>No</b> (amounts not reported from last reporting period <u>plus</u> activity from current reporting period exceed thresholds)

**NOTE:** If you are a candidate for statewide office, the general assembly or for a municipal office with a population over 100,000, that has filed a Statement of Exemption, then you must file an Exemption Statement of Limited Activity report for each reporting period. (§130.016 RSMo).
