The Missouri Ethics Commission, at its March 4, 2009 meeting, took the following action:

The Commission approved the following Joint Stipulation of facts, waiver of hearing before the Missouri Ethics Commission, and joint proposed Consent Order with findings of fact and conclusions of law:

05A119 Kenney Leadership Fund.

William Kenney and Kenney Leadership Fund affirm that they have corrected a reporting error by amending the relevant campaign finance disclosure report, and they are compliant with all Chapter 130 reporting requirements. A penalty is imposed in the amount of \$20,000.00. However, if Kenney and/or Kenney Leadership Fund pay a penalty of \$2,000.0 within 45 days of issuance of the consent order, the remainder of the penalty will be stayed for two years.

If William Kenney and the Kenney Leadership Fund have not committed any further violations of the campaign finance laws pursuant to Chapter 130, during the two year stay then William Kenney and the Kenney Leadership Fund will not be required to pay the balance of the penalty. If however, William Kenney and the Kenney Leadership Fund are found to have violated the campaign finance laws pursuant to Chapter 130 during the two year stay, William Kenney and the Kenney Leadership Fund will be jointly liable for paying the balance of the penalty as originally imposed by the Commission. The amount of the balance will be due immediately upon final adjudication finding William Kenney and the Kenney Leadership Fund guilty of the violation.
