# FAQs: Article VIII, Section 23

#### What are the contribution limits and what candidates do the limits apply to?

Article VIII, Section 23. 3(1), provides a contribution limit of \$2,600 from any person, other than the candidate, to elect an individual to the Missouri state offices of:

- Governor
  - Secretar
- Secretary of State 
   State Auditor
   State Senator
- State Judicial Office
- Lieutenant Governor
   State Treasurer
   Attorney General
   State Representative
   Other State Office

#### Are there restrictions in Article VIII, Section 23 that apply to both state and local candidates?

Yes, while the <u>contributions limits do not apply to local candidates</u>, there are numerous provisions that apply to all <u>candidate committees</u>, including local candidate committees:

- Candidate committees are prohibited from accepting or making contributions to another candidate committee, including federal candidate committees
- Candidate committees cannot make contributions to PACs/continuing committees
- Candidate committees cannot receive contributions from corporations (with some exceptions) and labor organizations directly (see question on corporation and labor organization contributions)
- Candidate committees can receive contributions from PACs/continuing committees
- Candidate committees can make contributions to, and receive contributions from political party committees

**Political Subdivisions: Is your contact information up to date?** If not, log in and update.

#### Check Status of your filers:

- Go to <u>our website</u>.
- Log in to the <u>Political Subdivision Filing System</u> (use your subdivision log in information. HINT: the MEC Online ID begins with the letter "S".)
- Select the "Filer Status" GO button and view each filer's status. Verify that your designated required filers have submitted their PFD.

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# Have you filed your PFD?

#### Annual Filers: May 1<sup>st</sup> deadline is fast approaching!

If your name was submitted to our office by a political subdivision (ex: state agency, county, city, board, school district, etc.) as a person required to file a Personal Financial Disclosure (PFD) statement because of a position you held or now hold with that subdivision, then you must file your PFD by **5:00 pm on May 1**<sup>st</sup>, **2017** (or postmarked by April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2017). Time period covered is from Jan 1<sup>st</sup>, 2016 - Dec 31<sup>st</sup>, 2016 (or portion of year that you served).



#### E-File your PFD

- 1. Complete <u>PFD E-Filer Account Re-</u> <u>quest</u>.
- Upon receipt of your MEC Online ID & Password (sent to the email address provided), log-in to the <u>PFD E-Filing</u> <u>System</u>.

## - Lobbying Report Due--

List of Principals & Legislative Action—Due May 30th

Avoid these common reporting errors:

- Only one report is required per principal; any one of multiple lobbyists that are registered to lobby on behalf of a principal may report for that principal.
- Must include general description of the proposed action.
- Report includes the lobbying of any action by an official agency, board or commission of state government (ex: if lobbying the head of a state agency, that action is reportable).

# **Campaign Finance Disclosure Reminders**

- April Quarterly: All committees must file April quarterly report no later than Monday, April 17<sup>th</sup>. View reporting deadlines in the <u>2017 Filing Dates Calendar</u>.
- Successful candidates must file *30 Day After Election Report* (if have expenditures or contributions made) BEFORE being sworn-in. Time period is from day after last report closed through the day before the swearing -in.
- Payments to campaign workers must be itemized, regardless of the amount. A campaign worker is someone that you hire to assist with your campaign activities (does not include unpaid volunteers).
- Continuing (PACS) and Political Party Committees report for the current calendar year. If April Quarterly is first report this year, remember to begin the committee's totals for receipts, expenditures and contributions made at zero (\$0.00) for 2017. The ending report totals for Money on Hand and Indebtedness are brought forward each reporting period for the life of the committee.
- The 48 Hour Report of Contribution of \$5,000 is required for a contribution (including a loan) received over \$5,000. It must be filed within 48 hours of receipt and filed electronically.

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
